#### PERSONAL PROPERTY



We have a few parents asking about lost items in school. Due to the size of the school, we do not have a lost property as such at the school. do not have a lost property as such. At the end of the day we encourage pupils to take home their belongings, which is always easier to manage when clothing and personal items home their belongings, which is always easier to manage which shows and personal items are named. Parents are always welcome to come and identify clothing and personal items at the end of the day.

Pupils should not bring any personal items such as toys to school, unless there is an agreed reason. When toys come into school, they can be broken, lost and distract from the learning of pupils. I would ask for your support in ensuring that only essential items are brought to school by all pupils.

It is most helpful if pupils can have a complete change of clothing in their school bags each day as the number of pupils who are in need of clean, dry, mud free clothes after break and lunch is increasing. We do have a limited amount of clothes in school but obviously not in every size for pupils. We do our best to find clothes for pupils and will only phone home if necessary.

Any pupil who has borrowed clean clothes at school should return them washed as soon as possible. Thank you for your help with this.

A change of outdoor to indoor shoes is also most helpful. Please ensure that indoors shoes are safe and practical as pupils also use their indoor shoes for indoor PE activities.
